NEW YORK, July 3 (A.P.)—Raymond J. Goodrich, 27, was charged with the slaying of 11-year-old Elizabeth Glavin in Detroit last Sept. 20. The girl was 11 years old at the time of the slaying, which was the first murder conviction in the history of the state since the death of a young girl in 1892.

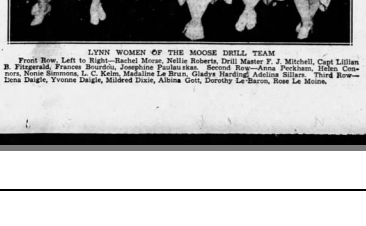
